No one else must be included.</p> <p>Write first the Name of the Chief Resident Officer, followed by the Names of his Wife, Children, and other Relatives; then the names of any Visitors, Boarders, and Servants; then the names of other Officers of the Institution, followed by the names of the Special Inmates—such as Guests, Paupers, Patients, &c.</p> <p>State whether Head, or Wife, Son, Daughter, Visitor, Guest, Boarder, Officer, Servant, &c., and give the designation of Inmates.</p> <p>Write either "Married," "Widower," "Wife," or "Single," opposite the Names of all Persons except Young Children.</p> <p>In the case of an Infant under One Year, state the age in Months, writing "Under 1 Month," "1 Month," "2 Months," &c.</p> <p>State the Occupation, if any, of each person (whether man, woman, or child). For those engaged in any trade or industry, state the particular branch, and also the material worked or dealt in.</p> <p>Write opposite the name of each person engaged in any trade or industry, either: (1) "Employer" (that is, employing persons other than domestic servants); (2) "Worker" (that is, a worker for an employer); or (3) "Own Account" that is, neither Employer nor working for Employer, but working on own account).</p> <p>Write opposite the name of each person carrying on trade or industry at home, the words "At Home."</p> <p>State the Birthplace of each person: (1) If in England or Wales, the County and Town, or Parish. (2) If in Scotland or Ireland, the name of the Country. (3) If in a British Colony or Dependency, the name of the Colony or Dependency. (4) If in a Foreign Country, the name of the Country, and whether the person be a "British Subject," a "Naturalized British Subject," or a "Foreign Subject," specifying nationality, such as "French, German, &c."</p> <p>If (1) Deaf and Dumb (2) Blind (3) Insane (4) Incurable Feeble-minded.</p> <p>Write the precise Infirmary, if any, opposite the name of the Person; and if the Infirmary dates from childhood, add "from childhood." Do not use such a general term as "Afflicted" or "Infirm."</p>
